

Editorial

Welcome to the latest edition of the RSPCA South London newsletter.

Since our Spring edition we have been very busy. On the animal welfare front we have been dealing with an ever-increasing number of cats and kittens coming into our care, a trend that has been repeated nationally.

Our intake has included taking in a heavily pregnant mother who subsequently gave birth to four adorable kittens, rescuing several stray cats, including one handed into one of our shops, and others where their owners could no longer cope for a variety of reasons. Every cat that comes to us has a thorough veterinary examination and is treated as necessary. They are also neutered and micro-chipped if not already done so and are then looked after until such time as we find a loving home to adopt them.

We have also launched our rabbit neutering scheme and are hoping to launch a rabbit fostering scheme similar to the one we already have in place with cats.






Luna's Story
